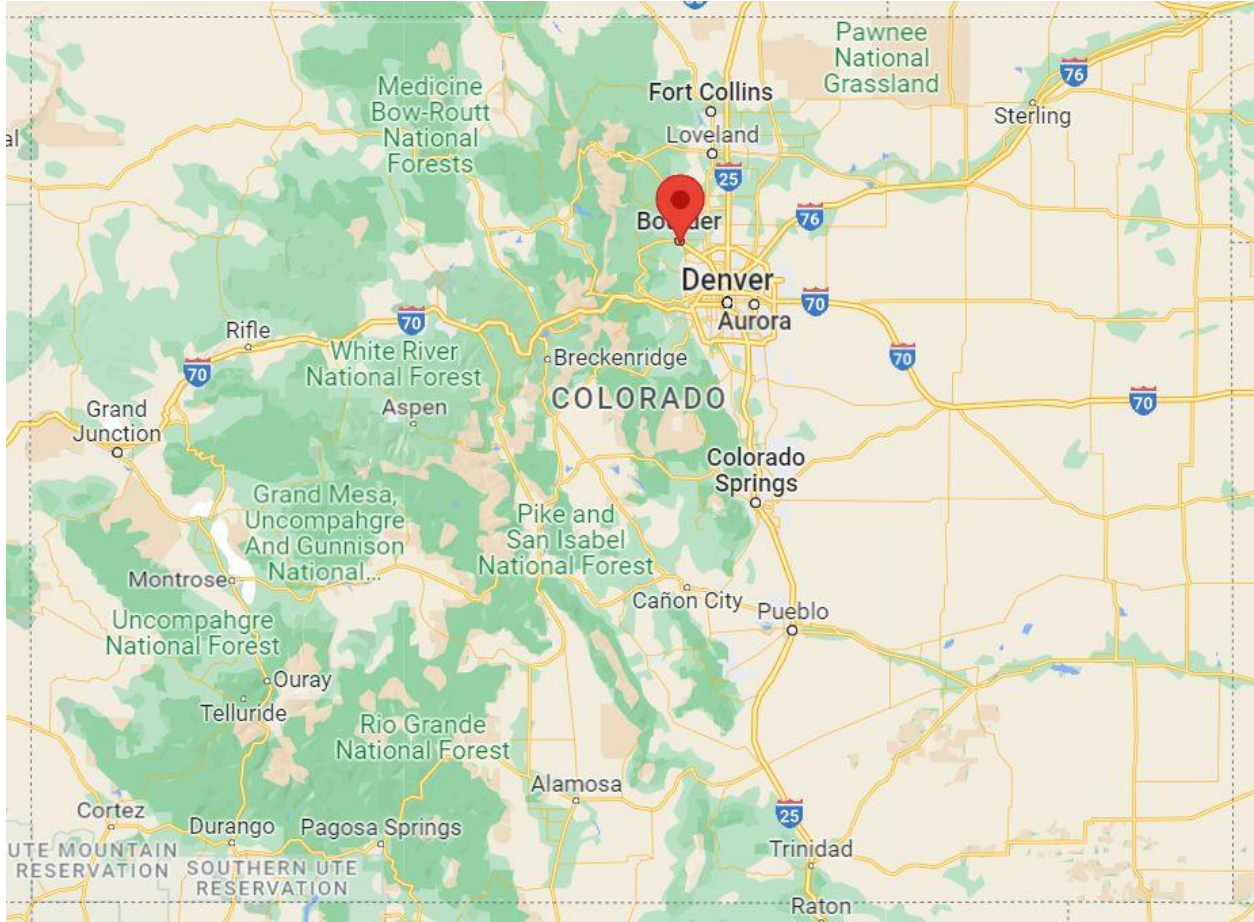

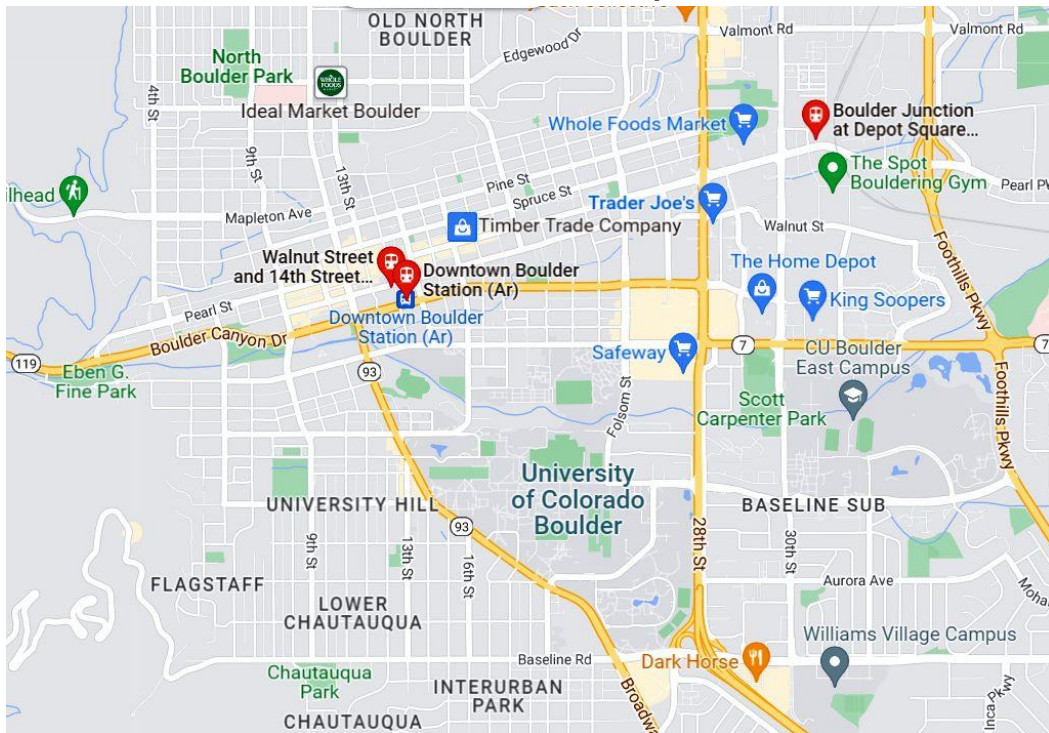

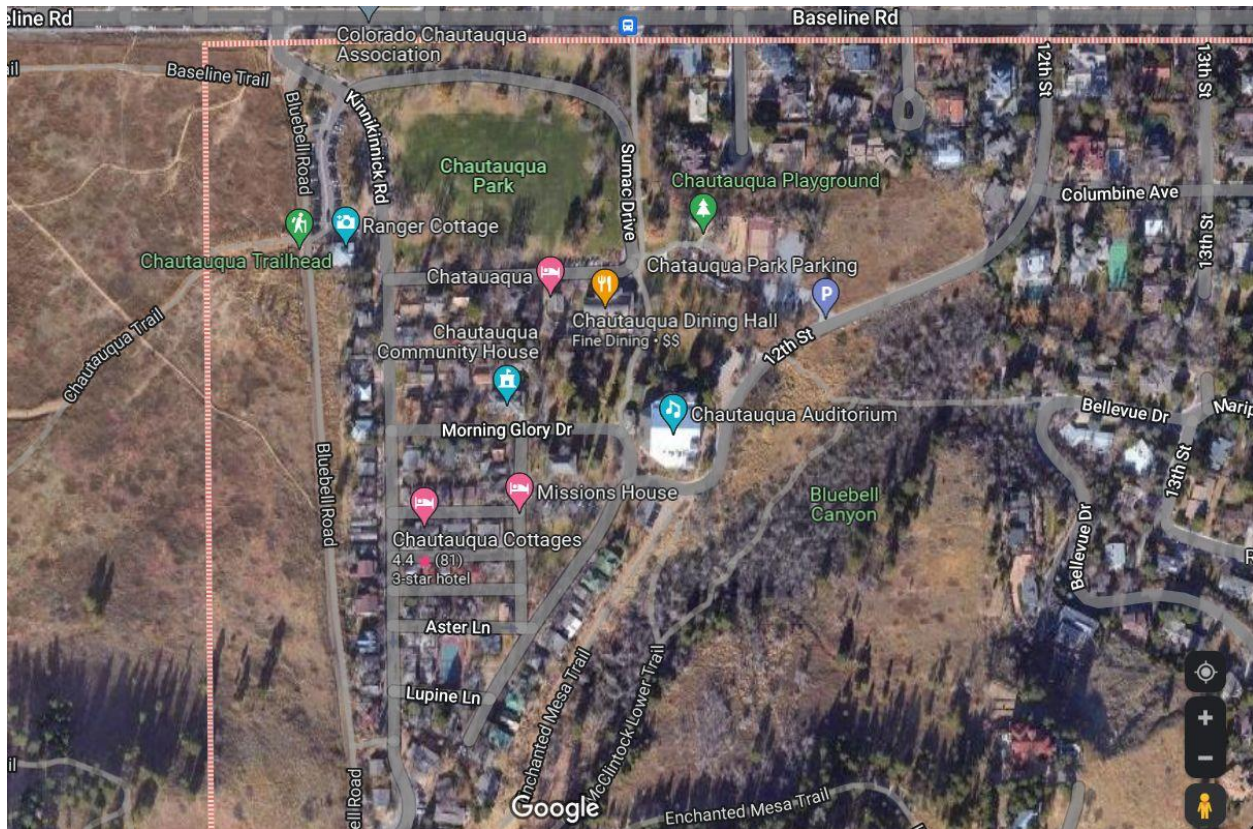

Colorado Chautauqua

Colorado Chautauqua

Our 2024 Gathering venue will be Colorado Chautauqua, a unique, historic site at the southern end of Boulder. Chautauqua dates back to 1898 when this “daughter Chautauqua” was established as a remote offshoot to the original Chautauqua near Jamestown, New York. The Chautauqua Movement originated to promote education and culture to the working class. It reached its height in the 1920’s and subsequently declined with the advent of movies, radio and television. The venue that is now Colorado Chautauqua was taken over by the City of Boulder in the 1970’s and eventually became a National Historic Landmark. It has since been operated as a public retreat center with lodging, dining and educational programs. The Chautauqua Auditorium, which dates back to the 1920’s has been restored and now serves as one of the venues for the Colorado Music Festival held every year from May through September. 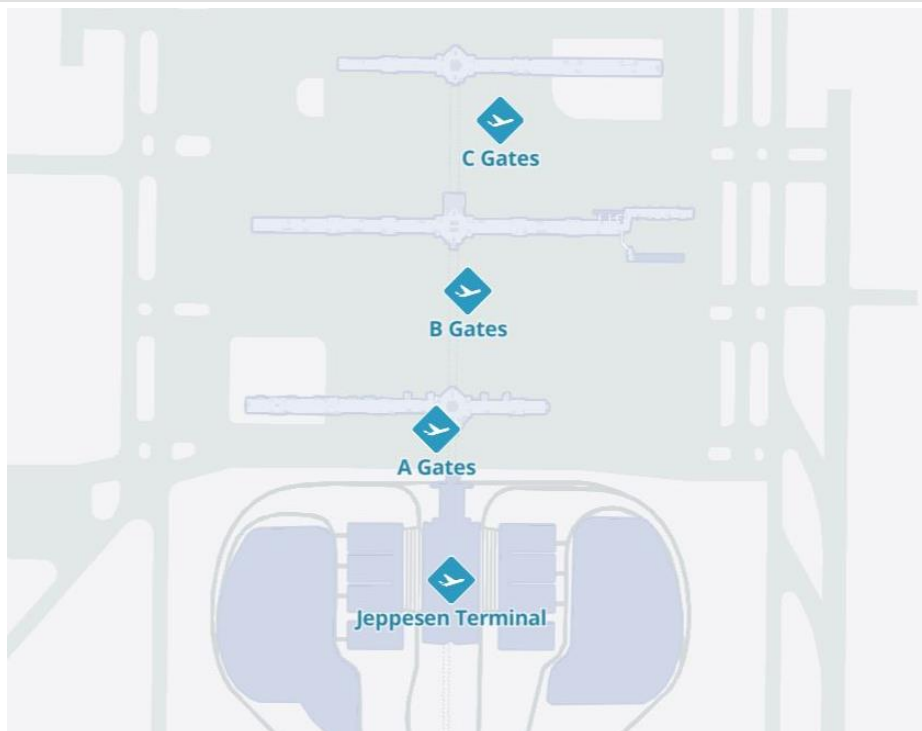

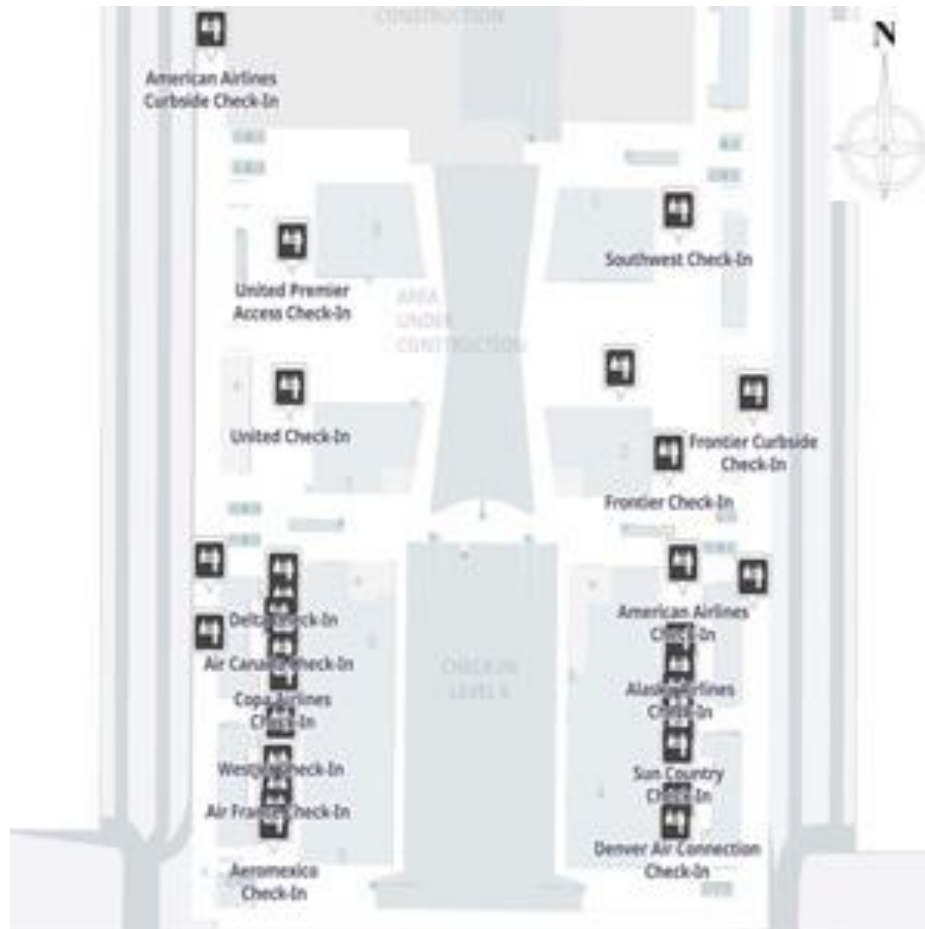

2. **Rail Travel** – Amtrak (www.amtrak.com)

The Amtrak Station is at Denver Union Station at 1701 Wynkoop St. in downtown Denver. From there, Regional Transportation District buses make frequent trips to and from Boulder.

3. **Bus** -As part of the Greyhound system, www.greyhound.com, many routes connect to Denver. However, there is no Greyhound Depot in Boulder.

2. **RTD Shuttles** - Denver International Airport to and from Boulder

The Regional Transportation District (RTD) operates a shuttle directly from the Denver International Airport to and from the Boulder Bus Station. As of early 2024, passes will be \$10.00 per person (\$1.35 for seniors over age 65) one way. Buses leave from Gate 8 at the Denver International Airport Transit Center. The Transit Center can be accessed at the south end of Jeppesen Terminal by exiting through the glass doors and taking the escalator or elevator down to ground level. There is service at least hourly from the airport to downtown Boulder between 5am and 11pm, and from Boulder to the airport between 3am and 9pm as of January 2023.

3. **Private Shuttles and Other Ride Services**

Lodging

1. Lodging at Chautauqua

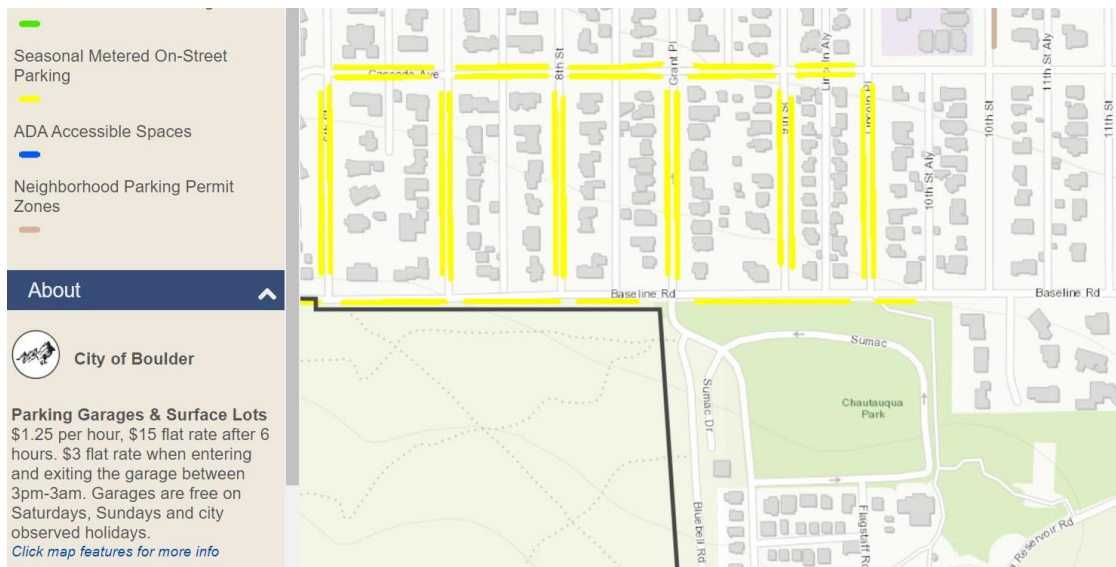
We have reserved and paid for 45 lodging units in Colorado Chautauqua, including studio, 1-bedroom and 2-bedroom units. We have reserved both standalone cottages and rooms in the Columbine Lodge. The exteriors of these units preserve the original character of the buildings but the interiors have been modernized. All of the units – except three studios in Columbine Lodge - have either kitchens or kitchenettes, private bathrooms, are air conditioned and have wifi. Most of the units have sofas which convert to foldaway beds for extra guests. The daily rates on the lodging units under our contract (including all taxes and fees) are:

Please note that these units are reserved by paying a deposit of one night cost of the lodging unit selected in the lodging unit type. Reservations must be made for a minimum of three nights (Aug. 11-13). Additional “shoulder” nights may be available but must be confirmed in advance. Deposits will be refunded prior to the event only if another registrant assumes the cost of the unit. 2. Parking at Chautauqua

Parking at Colorado Chautauqua for visitors is very limited! All lodgers at Chautauqua have a permitted space for each rented unit. What remains is public parking. Hikers often park within Chautauqua to use the numerous hiking trails around Chautauqua. There is additional public parking outside Chautauqua on Baseline Road which borders Chautauqua on the north, as well as on neighborhood streets just north of Chautauqua. **There is no guarantee of a parking space if you are not lodging on the Chautauqua campus.**

Reception (Monday evening)

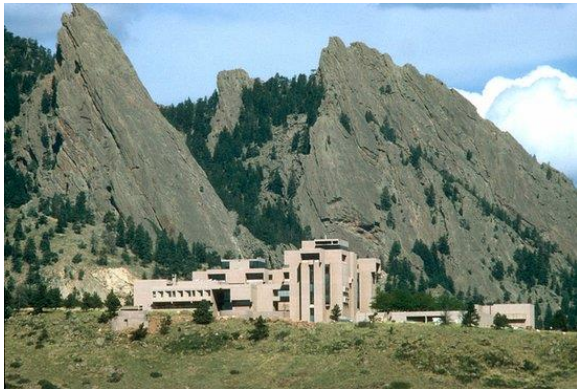
The Reception will be held in our presentation venue, the Grand Assembly Room in the Community House. The event will be catered by the Dining Hall and will

Guided Tour of the National Center for Atmospheric Research (Wednesday)

The National Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR) Mesa Lab, designed by famed architect I.M. Pei, sits nestled against the foothills of the Rocky Mountains in Boulder, Colorado. NCAR's Visitor Center connects scientific research about Earth system science, including weather and climate change, to the public through state-of-the-art exhibits, a variety of public tour options, and custom school field trips. We will have guided tours of the exhibits and facility specifically for our group on Wednesday afternoon.

NCAR is only a 10-minute drive from Colorado Chautauqua. While some attendees may prefer to drive because of flexibility, we expect to arrange transportation to and from NCAR.

- Museum of Boulder** – The Museum of Boulder is something of a legend in these parts and is the proud home of over 45,000 antique artifacts from the region. The museum is a period attraction in itself as it sits in the Harbeck-Berghei House which is also a National Historic Landmark in the town. The mission of the museum, which sits on University Hill, is to educate visitors about the historical significance of Boulder and to that end you will find rotating exhibits that tell the story of the town and the surrounding area. Items of interest here include historical documents, period photographs, and local antique items.

5. **Fiske Planetarium** – Located on the University of Colorado campus, the Fiske Planetarium is the place to come if you want to see some stars in Boulder. As you would expect, the planetarium is dedicated to all things related to the night sky and there are static and rotating exhibits, presentations, and shows that will tell you all you need to know about the galaxy. Daily shows take place in the Sky-Skan theatre dome where you will get the chance to be surrounded by a 65 foot screen that has the capacity to display over 20 million stars for your enjoyment. All shows are narrated with interesting information about the universe and if this ignites your enthusiasm even more then there are stargazing evenings held on Friday nights at the adjacent Sommers-Bausch Observatory.

8. **NSF National Ice Core Facility** - The National Science Foundation National Ice Core Facility (NSF-ICF), known as the National Ice Core Laboratory (NICL) before 2018, is the primary repository for ice cores collected by the United States. The facility is located at the Denver Federal Center in Lakewood, Colorado, and is managed by the United States Geological Survey (USGS). NSF-ICF is a facility for storing, curating, and studying meteoric ice cores recovered from the glaciated regions of the world. NSF-ICF provides scientists with the capability to conduct examinations and measurements on ice cores, and it preserves the integrity of these ice cores in a long-term repository for future investigations.

13. Rocky Mountain National Park - Rocky Mountain National Park is located approximately 55 mi northwest of Denver in north-central Colorado, within the Front Range of the Rocky Mountains. The park is situated between the towns of Estes Park to the east and Grand Lake to the west. The eastern and western slopes of the Continental Divide run directly through the center of the park with the headwaters of the Colorado River located in the park's northwestern region. The main features of the park include mountains, alpine lakes and a wide variety of wildlife within various climates and environments, from wooded forests to mountain tundra. The park has a total of five visitor centers, with park headquarters located at the Beaver Meadows Visitor Center—a National

Historic Landmark designed by the Frank Lloyd Wright School of Architecture at Taliesin West. National Forest lands surround the park on all sides, including Roosevelt National Forest to the north and east, Routt National Forest to the north and west, and Arapaho National Forest to the west and south, with the Indian Peaks Wilderness area located directly south of the park

If we are still dealing with the Covid-19 pandemic at the time of the Gathering, we will follow the regulations of our various venues. The safety of our attendees is of the utmost concern to the organizers of the Gathering and we hope the registrants will understand this position.

We encourage all Antarctican Society members to get vaccinated and boosted and to follow national and local guidelines for dealing with the pandemic.

High Altitude Adjustment

The elevation of Boulder is 5,430 feet. People coming from lower elevations will experience slightly lower oxygen levels and slightly higher UV radiation. Most adjust to the change without any significant problems. However, some may experience symptoms of altitude sickness (headaches, shortness of breath). If these symptoms persist or worsen, a doctor should be consulted.

Here are some basic tips to deal with high altitude:

- Drink plenty of water.
- Avoid excessive physical activity, and pace yourself as your body adjusts to the new altitude.
- Wear sunblock, sunglasses, and a hat.
- Certain clothing is identified as offering extra UV protection, and this can provide a benefit for extended outdoor recreation.
