THE ANTARCTICAN SOCIETY

By-Laws (as of September 24, 1959)

1. Purpose

The purpose of the Antarctican Society is to facilitate the friendly and informal exchange of information and views on Antarctica.

2. Membership

Any person interested in Antarctica is eligible for membership. To become a member it is necessary for the applicant to communicate his name and address in writing to the Secretary of the Society.

3. Officers

In January of each year the members shall elect the Officers of the Society, including the President, Vice President, Secretary, and such other Officers as the membership may desire to elect.

(At the January 1960 meeting consideration will be given to the election of a Board of Directors of sixteen, and the establishment of a procedure whereby each Director would serve for four years, and four new Directors be elected each January to replace the four Directors whose terms expire at that time.)

4. Dues

There are no dues.

(At the annual meeting in January the membership will consider whether annual dues in a nominal amount, perhaps \$1.00, should be assessed on the members to cover postage and similar charges, and to facilitate the task of the Secretary in keeping the membership list up to date.)

5. Meetings

The Antarctican Society shall meet once a month in some suitable place in Washington. Notification of each meeting shall be communicated to the members opportunely by the Secretary.
